

New Rules Passed:

At the Board of Trustees meeting on Monday, August 15, 2011 the following changes were passed:

1. **SPECIAL DISCOUNTS AFTER 5PM:** After 5 PM each day that the pool is open all guests shall be charged only \$5 to enter and use the pool.
2. **CHILDREN UNLIMITED ON WEEKDAYS:** Monday through Friday children of residents who are 18 years and older will not be restricted in the number of times they can use the pool during the weekdays.
3. **GRILLE LUNCH OPTION:** A Day Visitor Pass shall be issued without charge and without limitation subject to the following conditions:
 - 1 The visitor is an adult 18 years of age and older and accompanied by a resident adult 18 years of age and older, and
 2. The purpose of their visit is to have lunch at the Park Grille, and
 3. The Day Visitors Pass is issued only for Monday through Friday, except holidays, and
 4. The visitor leaves a valid driver's license at the pool entry booth, and
 5. The visitors pass shall only be valid for 1 ½ hours, and
 6. When leaving, the visitor must show a valid lunch receipt from the Park Grille which contains the date the lunch was served, and
 7. If the visitor uses the pool or extends his/her stay beyond the 1 ½ hour time limit, the resident must pay the applicable guest fees plus an administrative fee of \$25.
4. **SAME SEX SPOUSES GET SAME RIGHTS AS HETEROSEXUAL COUPLES WHEN THEY LEASE:** The definition of tenants, which permits use of the Park, now includes spouses, whether of the same or different sex, as permitted under section 10-A of the New York State Domestic Relations Law and children. When these individuals 1) have a signed lease for a private residence with an owner(s) of a residence in East Hills, 2) the lease must be for a period of one year or more; and 3) the provisions of the lease contain an assignment by the owner(s) to the tenants and the members of their immediate family all the privileges the owner(s) has to use the Park at East Hills during the entire term of the tenancy, then Park passes shall be issued and they shall be given Park privileges.
