Museum of the Moving Image

The **Museum of the Moving Image**, located in **Astoria, Queens**, is the country's only museum dedicated to the art, history, technique, and technology of the moving image in all its forms. The Museum is a one-of-a-kind destination for audiences of all ages and interests, from connoisseurs of classic cinema to children and families to avid gamers.

Embracing a wide range of subjects, from nineteenth century optical toys to the latest in digital art, the Museum explores every phase of the production, promotion, and exhibition of moving images.

The core exhibition of the Museum, *Behind the Screen* is a one-of-a-kind experience that immerses visitors in the creative and technical process of producing, promoting, and presenting films, television shows, and digital entertainment. After our tour of the Museum we will be having lunch at **5 Napkin Burger** which is directly across the street from the Museum.

explain the 1930s increase of intolerance, the reduction of human rights, and the lack of intervention that enabled the persecution and mass murder of millions of Jews and others, including people with disabilities, Gypsies, Jehovah’s Witnesses, Gays, and Polish intelligentsia.

The museum introduces visitors to European antecedents which nurtured the evolution of Nazism, such as centuries of antisemitism and racism, the pseudo-science of eugenics, and the repercussions of WWI. The Holocaust exhibition concludes with the aftermath of Nazism and emphasizes the issues of displaced persons camps, emigration, and post-genocide justice. One feature that distinguishes this museum from other Holocaust museums is that it demonstrates the relevance of the Holocaust through an examination of current genocides and intolerance and by the celebration of today’s genocide rescuers and Upstanders.

After our tour of the Museum we will all meet for **Lunch at the Jolly Fisherman**, a Roslyn Landmark. **The cost of the Tour and Lunch will be \$25 per person for residents and \$35 per person for non residents.**
